## Guidance

**Description of Severity** Interpretation

Extremely harmful serious injury or death is possible

Harmful there could be significant damage or injury

Slightly harmful damage or injury would be local and superficial at worst

**Description of Likelihood** Interpretation

Likely incident is certain or near certain to occur

Unlikely incident may occur

Highly unlikely incident is highly unlikely to occur

Risk Level	Action and Timescale
TRIVIAL	No action is required and no documentary records need to be kept.
TOLERABLE	No additional controls are required. Consideration may be given to a more cost- effective solution or improvement that imposes no additional cost burden. Monitoring is required to ensure that controls are maintained.
MODERATE	Efforts should be made to reduce the risk, but the costs of prevention should be carefully measured and limited. Risk reduction measures should be implemented within a defined time period.  Where the moderate risk is associated with extremely harmful consequences, further assessment may be necessary to establish precisely the likelihood of harm as a basis for determining the need for improved control measures.
SUBSTANTIAL	Work should not be started until the risk has been reduced. Considerable resources may have to be allocated to reduce the risk. Where the premises are already in use, urgent action should be taken.
INTOLERABLE	Work should not be started or continued until the risk has been reduced. If it is not possible to reduce risk even with unlimited resources, work has to remain prohibited.
